AN ACT to Provide for a Reduced Fee for Lobster and Crab Fishing Licenses for Residents 60 Years of Age or Over.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 642I, sub-§ 7, as amended by PL 1977, c. 713, § 4, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

7. Fee. The fee for the license shall be \$25, except that the fee for applicants who are under the age of 17 years or who are 60 years of age or over at the time of issuance of that license shall be \$10.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit persons who are 60 years of age or older to purchase a lobster and crab fishing license at a reduced fee. The fee would be \$10, which is the same amount now charged for persons who are under the age of 17 years.
