COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 166, L.D. 373, Bill,
"AN ACT to Repeal the License Requirement for Taking Certain Clams."

Amend the Bill by striking out all of the title and inserting in its place the following: 'AN ACT to Allow the Taking of Certain Clams without a License.'

Further amend the Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:

- '12 MRSA §6601, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, §5, is amended to read:
- 4. Personal use exception. Any person may take or possess no more than 1/2 bushel of shellfish or 3 bushels of "hen" or "surf" clams for personal use in one day without a license, unless municipal ordinances further limit the taking of shellfish.

## Statement of Fact

This amendment will allow any person to take up to 3 bushels of "surf" or "hen" clams without a shellfish license. Beyond that amount, a license will be required.
