STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Provide for Public Rest Room Facilities in Shopping Centers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

22 MRSA c. 270, is enacted to read:

CHAPTER 270

SHOPPING CENTERS

§ 1651. Public rest room facilities required

In any building or facility, constructed specifically as a shopping center after the effective date of this chapter, there shall be installed a minimum of 2 toilets for the use of the public. These toilets shall be clearly marked and maintained in a sanitary condition and good repair. There shall be no charge for their use.

§ 1652. Shopping center defined

For the purposes of this chapter, a "shopping center" is defined as any building or facility containing 6 or more separate retail establishments, planned, developed, owned or managed as a unit, with an off-street public parking area of not less than 2 acres.

§ 1653. Rules and regulations

The Department of Human Services shall have the power, for the purpose of protecting the public health, to make rules interpreting and enforcing this chapter.

§ 1654. Enforcement

This chapter shall be enforced by the Division of Health Engineering. Anyone violating the provisions of this chapter or regulations thereunder commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not more than \$200 may be adjudged.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require shopping centers of 6 or more retail stores to provide public toilets, free of charge.
