
SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P.
434, L.D. 551, Bill, "AN ACT Establishing Penalties for Cutting
Timber Without the Owner's Permission."

Amend the Amendment by striking out all of subsection 1 of
that part designated "§2510." and inserting in its place the following

'1. Unlawful cutting. Any person who intentionally, knowingly,
recklessly or negligently cuts down or fells any tree, except in
the performance of activities carried out pursuant to Title 23,
section 701, without the consent of the owner of the property on
which the tree stands commits a civil violation for which the
forfeitures provided in this section may be adjudged.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to exempt the cutting or felling
of trees in the performance of activities carried out pursuant to
Title 23, section 701.
