STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Reduce the Age Requirement for Complimentary Fishing and Trapping Licenses from 70 to 65.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2401-B, sub-§ 13, as last amended by PL 1977, c. 167, is further amended to read:

13. Complimentary licenses to persons over 65 years of age. A complimentary license to hunt or fish, or a combination hunting and fishing license shall be issued to any resident of Maine who is over ~~70~~ 65 years of age and applies therefor to the commissioner. Such application shall be accompanied by a birth certificate or other certified evidence of the applicant's date of birth and residency. Each such license shall remain valid for 3 calendar years from date of issue.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill reduces from 70 to 65 the age requirement for complimentary hunting and fishing licenses.
