AN ACT Concerning the Training of Dogs while Bear Hunting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2355-D, as amended by PL 1975, c. 266, § 2, is further amended to read:

§ 2355-D. Hunting bear with dogs

It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons hunting together, to use more than 4 6 dogs at any one time for the purpose of hunting bear.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill increases from 4 to 6 the number of dogs which a person may use to hunt bear. This will permit 2 dogs to be trained while 2 experienced dogs are used to hunt bear and 2 more to tree.
