**AN ACT to Reduce the Residency Requirement for Certain Disabled Veterans'
Property Tax Exemptions from 10 Years to 2 Years.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

36 MRSA § 653, sub-§ 1, ¶ F, sub-¶ (1), is amended to read:

(1) A veteran must have been a resident of this State at the time of his entry into service; or have been a resident of this State for at least ~~10~~ 2 years prior to making the claim for exemption; and

STATEMENT OF FACT

At the present time, a disabled veteran who wants to claim a disabled veteran's property tax exemption must either have been a resident of Maine at the time of his entry into the service or must have been a resident of Maine for 10 years prior to making the claim for the exemption.

This bill will permit a veteran who was not a resident of Maine when he entered the service to claim the property tax exemption after having been a Maine resident for 2 years, instead of the present 10 years.
