COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 641, L.D. 795, Bill,
"AN ACT to Amend the Prohibition of Issuing Fisheries and
Wildlife Licenses to Persons Convicted of Certain Offenses."

Amend the Bill by striking out everything after the
enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:

'12 MRSA §2404, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 305, is amended
by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

Any person convicted of a violation of this section
shall not be eligible to obtain any license issued
by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for 3 years
from the date of conviction in the case of a first offense and
5 years from the date of conviction in the case of a 2nd or
subsequent offense. Any licenses in effect at the time of
conviction shall be considered revoked and surrendered to the
commissioner.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment would attach mandatory license suspension
periods to those convicted of taking or molesting traps or
animals in traps.
