COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 310, L.D. 901, Bill,
"AN ACT to Prohibit Taking Antlerless Deer in Certain Municipalities
and Townships."

Amend the Bill by inserting at the end before the Statement
of Fact the following:

'Fiscal Note

The department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife estimates
that this bill could have a substantial fiscal impact on its
dedicated funds. It estimates that if approximately 6,000 hunters
currently hunting in Management Unit 3 would either not hunt at
all or hunt elsewhere, based upon the assumption that they
would not hunt at all, the maximum cost from loss of revenue would
be as follows:

3,000 nonresident licenses at \$60	\$180,000
3,000 resident licenses at \$12	36,000
	<u>\$216,000</u>

If these hunters hunt in other units, the revenue loss would
not be as much.

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this Amendment is to add a fiscal note
to the bill.
