IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT Concerning Retirement Benefits Under the Maine State Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

5 MRSA § 1092, sub-§ 3, as amended by PL 1975, c. 622, §§ 22 and 23, is further amended to read:

3. Retirement benefit for policemen, fire fighters, local district employees, sheriffs and full-time deputy sheriffs. Any participating local district, by filing with the board of trustees a duly certified copy of its action, may provide a retirement benefit for policemen, fire fighters, sheriffs and full-time deputy sheriffs or any other participating local district employees, in lieu of the retirement benefits otherwise provided in this chapter for these employees, of $\frac{1}{2}$ average final compensation, after having completed 20 to 25 years of service **or a retirement age of 50 to 60 years.**

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill will allow the participating local districts to provide for a lower retirement age if they so desire.
