AN ACT to Authorize a School Nursing Health Consultant in the Department of Educational and Cultural Services.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 20 MRSA § 1135-A is enacted to read:

§ 1135-A. School nursing health consultant

For the purposes of assisting local educational agencies in complying with this subchapter, and other school health responsibilities, there shall be a school nursing health consultant within the Department of Educational and Cultural Services, who shall serve as the liaison between local school nursing personnel and the Division of Public Health Nursing in the Department of Human Services. The school nursing health consultant shall be licensed as a registered nurse in the State and shall have education and experience in school health or community nursing.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds shall be appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act:
