AN ACT to Create the Bruce McCrea Game Sanctuary in Fort Fairfield.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2101, as last amended by PL 1977, c. 503, § 9, is further amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

Bruce McCrea Game Sanctuary, Fort Fairfield: The following described territory situated in Fort Fairfield, Aroostook County, Maine, to wit: Land of Richard A. Peters lying between the Russell Road and the Aroostook River; land of Wayne and Marilyn Thibeau lying between the Russell Road and the Aroostook River; land of Dallas and Janet McCrea lying between the Russell Road and the Aroostook River; land of Dallas and Janet McCrea lying between the Russell Road and the East Limestone Road; land of Richard and Theresea Poirier lying between the Aroostook Falls Road and the Aroostook River; and land of James and Sharon Ouellette lying between the Aroostook Falls Road and the Aroostook River; also all of the waters of the Aroostook River north of, or downriver from, a line across the river, which line is an extension in an easterly direction of the south line of land of Dallas and Janet McCrea, lying between the Russell Road and the river.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to establish a wild game and wild bird sanctuary on part of the Aroostook River and land adjacent thereto in Fort Fairfield, Aroostook County, Maine.
