**AN ACT to Exempt Out-of-State Technical and Vocational Schools from
Registration under the Transient Sellers Law.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

32 MRSA § 4681, sub-§ 3, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 440, § 2, is amended to read:

3. Merchandise. "Merchandise" includes any objects, wares, goods, promises, commodities, intangibles, services or other things of value but does not include food or technical and vocational schools located outside of the State which are registered pursuant to Title 20, section 2661.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Technical and vocational schools located outside of the State are subject to duplicate registration requirements. They currently must register both with the Department of Educational and Cultural Services and with the Department of Business Regulation. Both registration procedures require the posting of bond for consumer protection. This bill eliminates duplicate registration in favor of registration solely with the Department of Educational and Cultural Services.
