# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

#### AN ACT Concerning the Salary of the Attorney General.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 2 MRSA § 7, sub-§ 1, first sentence, as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 697, § 3, is amended to read:

Notwithstanding section 6 or any other provision of law, the respective salaries of the Attorney General Secrectary of State, State Auditor and Treasurer of State shall be as follows:

- Sec. 2. 2 MRSA  $\S$  7, sub- $\S$  1,  $\P$  A, as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 697,  $\S$  3, is repealed.
- Sec. 3. 5 MRSA § 191, 7th sentence, as last amended by PL 1971, c. 550, § 2, is further amended to read:

The Attorney General shall have an office in the State Capitol and shall receive an annual salary in full for all services the same salary as that of an Associate Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that the Attorney General receives the same salary as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court.
