### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Authorize Per Diem for Members of an Advisory Committee or Panel of the New England Regional Fisheries Management Council.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. 12 MRSA § 6022, sub-§ 13 is enacted to read:
- 13. Per diem for members of advisory committee or panel of NERFMC. The commissioner may pay \$50 per diem to any person appointed to an advisory committee or panel of the New England Regional Fisheries Management Council for each day spent in attending any council meeting, advisory committee or panel meeting or in undertaking any other official council business. The commissioner shall adopt regulations to govern this section.
- Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds shall be appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill allows the Commissioner of Marine Resources to pay per diem to state residents who advise the New England Regional Fisheries Management Council. The council has authority to make decisions that are extremely important to Maine's fishing industry. In making these decisions, the council commonly creates advisory panels of industry members to give advice and counsel to the council. It is critical that Maine be adequately represented on these advisory councils. This bill will alleviate the hardship of serving in this capacity and will insure that Maine's voice is heard in the formulation of fisheries' policy.
