STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT Concerning Part-time Licenses under the Liquor Statutes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 28 MRSA § 201, 2nd sentence, as amended by PL 1977, c. 23, § 2, is further amended to read:

A part-time or 6-months' license, as authorized by law, may be issued to any natural person who is at least 20 years of age and is a citizen of the United States.

Sec. 2. 28 MRSA § 201-A is enacted to read:

§ 201-A. Part-time license

A part-time license issued pursuant to this Title shall be valid of a period of 7 calendar months during the 12-month period following its issuance. The 7 months need not run consecutively, but the months during which the license is valid shall be set out on the license. Any person making application for a part-time license shall, on the application, designate which 7 months he wishes the license to be valid.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide for a 7-month part-time license under the liquor laws. The license will be valid for 7 months of the year and the 7 months need not run consecutively.
