SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1281, L.D. 1534, Bill, "AN ACT
Regarding Laws Relating to Town Lines."


Amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "§2001-A."
in subsection 6 by striking out all of the last sentence and
inserting in its place the following:

'If monmuments have been disturbed or destroyed, or for some other
reason it becomes necessary to precisely locate the boundary line,
the municipal officers shall locate and monument the line, so that
the certification required by subsection 5 may be completed.'

Further amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated
"§2001-A." subsection 7, by inserting at the end of paragraph A,
before the punctuation, the following: 'excepting water crossings
which exceed the interval'

Statement of Fact

This amendment removes the requirement that a qualified
registered land surveyor supervise locating the line and also
excepts water crossings of over 500 meters, through which the line
runs, from the requirement of having a monument at least every
500 meters.
