**AN ACT to Provide a Special Restaurant Malt Liquor License in the Town of
Georgetown.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Special malt liquor license; Robinhood Marina, Georgetown.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of the law, the State Liquor Commission is hereby authorized to issue a special restaurant malt liquor license valid only at the Robinhood Marina, Inc. facilities and subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Approval.** The license application shall be approved by the municipal officers of Georgetown;
- 2. Validity.** The license shall be valid from October 2, 1979, through October 9, 1979, and shall not be renewable;
- 3. Area of sale.** The sale and consumption of malt liquor shall be confined to a designated area only and shall be subject to the provisions of the Revised Statutes, Title 28, section 4, relating to business hours; and
- 4. Fee.** The fee for this special license shall be \$40 and shall accompany the application.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Enactment of this measure would grant a special nonrenewable restaurant malt liquor license in the Town of Georgetown, which has voted not to allow the sale of malt liquor in a restaurant on a regular basis.
