**AN ACT Authorizing the State Museum Bureau of Procure a Replica of "The
Maine Lobsterman".**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Replica authorized. Pursuant to private and special law 1975, chapter 116, the State Museum Bureau is authorized to procure a bronze replica of "The Maine Lobsterman" for public display at a suitable location within the nation's capital, Washington, D. C.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill authorizes the State Museum Bureau to have a replica of "The Maine Lobsterman" conveyed to the State by Theodora Kahill, the sculptor's heir. Currently, no further replicas of the statute are permitted without authorization of the Legislature. Congressman David Emery is presently sponsoring legislation in Washington, D. C. which would permit a replica of the statute to be located in the nation's capital.
