Amend the Amendment in Part B by inserting after section 17 the following:

'Sec. 18. 15 MRSA §1254, as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 114, §27, is amended to read:

§1254. Juror's oath or affirmation in cases punishable by

## imprisonment

The following oath shall be administered to jurors in criminal cases: "You swear, that in all causes committed to you, you will give a true verdict therein, according to the <u>law and</u> evidence given you. So help you God." Any juror, conscientiously scrupulous of taking an oath, may affirm in the mode described in section 1253.'

Further amend the Amendment in Part B by renumbering the sections to read consecutively according to Title and section.

## Statement of Fact

This amendment removes an inconsistency between the provisions concerning jurors' oaths in criminal and civil cases.
