HOUSE AMENDMENT" A" to H.P.1534, L.D.1683, Bill, "AN ACT Clarify the Education Law."

Amend the bill by inserting after section 3 the following: 'Sec. 4. 20 MRSA §302, last ¶, first sentence, as repealed and replaced by PL 1969, c. 140, is repealed.

Sec. 5. 20 MRSA §302, as last amended by 1977, c. 24, §4, is further amended by adding at the end the following new paragraphs:

The school directors shall determine their compensation, not less than \$10 and not to exceed \$25, for the services for each board meeting that each attends. Whenever the directors vote to increase their compensation they shall submit the matter to the legal voters in the municipalities which comprise the district. Upon notification by the directors, the municipal officers of the municipalities shall, at the next regular or special town meeting or city election, as the case may be, prepare a ballot for the purpose of voting in favor of or opposition to the proposed increase, and the question shall be in the following form:

"Should School Administrative District directors be (number of district) paid compensation at the rate of \$ for each meeting which each director attends?"

No increase in compensation is effective unless approved by 2/3 of the voters voting on the question.

Further amend the bill by renumbering the sections to read consecutively.

Statement of Fact

This amendment resolves an existing inequity in Title 20. Presently, School Administrative District directors are paid between \$5 and \$10 per meeting. This amendment would change these figures to \$10 to \$25 and subject any proposed increase, within those amounts, to a vote of the voters in the district.
