HOUSE AMENDMENT/TO SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 658,
L.D. 1698, Bill, "AN ACT to Establish the Boundary between
Rockport and Rockland."

Amend the amendment by inserting before the first paragraph the following:

'Amend the bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following:

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, there is presently some question concerning the proper boundary between Rockport and Rockland; and

Whereas, unless the boundary is established immediately it will not be possible to determine in which municipality certain land lies and in which municipality that land should be taxed; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, '

Further amend the amendment by striking out at the beginning of the first paragraph the following "Amend" and in-

serting in its place the following 'Further amend'

Further amend the amendment by inserting before the statement of fact the following:

'Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to add an emergency preamble and an emergency clause to the bill.
