SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to H.P. 1636, L.D. 1745, Bill,
"AN ACT to Provide for Per Diem Compensation for Active Retired
Judges."

Amend the Bill by striking out all of the emergency preamble
and the emergency clause.

Further amend the Bill in section 1 in that part designated
"\$6-B." in the 6th line (5th and 6th lines in L.D.) by striking
out the underlined words and figures "\$75 per day or \$40" and
inserting in their place the following: '\$50 per day or \$30'

Further amend the Bill in section 2 in that part designated
"\$104-A." by striking out in the 6th line (4th line in L.D.)
the underlined words and figures "\$75 per day or \$40" and
inserting in their place the following: '\$50 per day or \$30'

Further amend the Bill in section 4 in the 7th line (5th line
in L.D.) by striking out the underlined words and figures
"\$75 per day or \$40" and inserting in their place
the following: '\$50 per day or \$30'

Further amend the Bill by striking out all of section 5
and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 5. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated
from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
