COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1674, L.D. 1781, Bill,
"AN ACT to Add the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural
Services to the Energy Testing Laboratory of Maine and to
Correct References to the Oil and Solid Fuel Burner Technicians
Licensing Board."

Amend the Bill by inserting after section 11 the following:

'Sec. 12. 32 MRSA §2402, sub-§2, as last amended by PL 1979,
c. 569, §15, is further amended by adding at the end the
following new paragraph:

A person holding a license as a master oil burner technician
is not required to pay a fee to be licensed as a master
solid fuel burner technician, as long as he meets all other
requirements and pays the examination fee required by section
2403. a person holding a license as a master solid fuel burner
technician is not required to pay a fee to be licensed
as a master oil burner technician, as long as he meets all
other requirements and pays the examination fee required by
section 2403. Any person who has heretofore paid a fee for
both master licenses held simultaneously shall be given a credit
for one license fee less the examination fee, which shall
be applied to
the next renewal.'

Further amend the Bill by renumbering section 12 to be
section 13 of the bill.

Fiscal Note

It is estimated that enactment of this amendment will result in a loss of revenue of between \$6,500 and \$9,750 each biennium.

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to ensure that a master oil burner technician is not required to pay another \$65 license fee in order to become a master solid fuel burner technician, or vice versa. Anyone holding one master license would still have to qualify for the other master license but would only have to pay the examination fee. The amendment gives a license renewal credit to those who have already paid both license fees.
