SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 677, L.D. 1784, Bill, "AN ACT Appropriating Funds to Allow Maine State Retirement System Members a Cost-of-Living Increase."

subsection 1, 2nd sentence,
Amend the amendment in section 1, by striking out the figure "\$12" and inserting in its place the following: '\$6'

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of sections 2 and 3 and inserting in their place the following:

'Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Sec. 3. Appropriation. The following funds are allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Further amend the amendment by striking out the fiscal note and inserting in its place the following:

'Fiscal Note

This amendment will require an appropriation of \$661,007 for fiscal year 1980-81. In addition to this appropriation there will be an allocation of \$224,810 to be prorated among all other state funds and amounts. The total appropriation and allocation will be \$885,817.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment reduces the cost-of-living increase^{for} the retired state employees and teachers from \$12 per month to \$6 per month.
