HOUSE AMENDMENT "E" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" TO H.P. 1723, L.D. 1827, Bill " AN ACT to Amend Allocations from the Highway Fund for the Fiscal Years from July 1, 1979 to June 30, 1980 and from July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981, Decrease the State Aid Bonus from 40% to 20%, and Revise Drivers' License and Examination Fees."

Amend the amendment by striking out sections 1 to 10 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §1103, last ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 696, §193, is amended to lead:

The department shall increase its apportionment of state aid by 40% 30% of the state aid joint fund so expended for reconstruction of improved state or state aid highways or for construction of unimproved bridges and approaches under the Bridge Act, provided the bridge is located between sections of improved state aid highways.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this amendment is to maintain the existing funding ratio of the State Police Budget and further reduce budget allocations by \$2,000,000 to fund the State Police from the Highway Fund. At the present time, the State Police budget is funded 75 percent'from the Highway Fund and 25 percent from the General Fund.

In order to maintain the existing funding ratio of the State Police Budget, this amendment revised Committee Amendment "A" by:

1. reducing the State Aid bonus from 40 percent) to 30 per-/cont for a saving of \$675,000;

 further reducing the winter maintenance allocation in 1979-80 by \$225,000;

3. further reducing the summer maintenance account by \$500,000 For fiscal year 1980-81;

 further reducing the "own Road Improvement Fund by \$400,000 for fiscal year 1980-81; and

5. reducing the Picnic Area Construction Account for 1980-81 by \$100,000.

Effects of the additional reductions in allocations

Reducing the State Aid Bonus from 40% to 30% will affect 250 municipalities which currently qualify for the 40% bonus. The average impact is \$2,700 per municipality. However, some towns will not be as adversely affected as others. One town may experience a \$1,000 reduction while another municipality may experience a \$5,000 reduction.

By reducing the winter maintenance account by an additional \$225,000 for fiscal year 1979-80, there will be no significant impact upon the State. As of December 31, 1979, there were savHOUSE AMENDMENT "E" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to HP 1723, LD 1827

ings in excess of \$700,000 in this account.

The additional reduction in the summer maintenance account of \$500,000 will reduce summer paving by roughly 100 miles. The Governor's bill reduced summer paving by more than 400 miles. Committee Amendment "A" reduces summer paving by 200 miles, and this amendment reduces summer paving by 300 miles.

The reduction in the Town Road Improvement Fund will not have any serious impact upon the towns. Currently, there is a \$1,500,000 balance in this account.

The \$100,000 reduction in the Picnic Area Construction account will have no adverse effects. This allocation is a construction account and not a maintenance fund.
