STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY

**AN ACT Relating to the Effective Date of Administrative Change in the
Employment Security Law.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the First Regular Session of the 109th Legislature and the Governor intended for Public Law 1979, chapter 579, to become effective 90 days after the adjournment of the First Regular Session; and

Whereas, unless this Act is amended to provide that it take effect immediately, it will not take effect until 90 days after adjournment of the Second Regular Session of the 109th Legislature; and

Whereas, the changes set out in this Act are immediately necessary to clarify policy making and provide for effective administration under the Employment Security Law; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

PL 1979, c. 579. Public Law 1979, chapter 579, entitled “AN ACT to Clarify the Administration of the Department of Manpower Affairs” shall take effect upon the approval of this Act.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Public Law 1979, chapter 579, as enacted by the First Regular Session of the 109th Legislature, was not approved until January of this year due to a processing oversight. This Act will enable the law to become effective in the most timely manner.
