STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY

AN ACT to Provide for Improved Information on Workers' Compensation and to Provide Funds for Full-time Workers' Compensation Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. **39 MRSA § 108**, as amended by PL 1975, c. 771, § 425, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§ 108. Annual report

The Director of the Bureau of Labor shall provide an annual report relating to the number and character of occupational injuries and their effect upon the injured, as required under Title 26, section 42.

The chairman of the commission and the Superintendent of Insurance shall further assist the Director of the Bureau of Labor to assure that necessary information regarding the administrative processes, costs and other factors related to the Workers' Compensation Act and the Occupational Disease Law are included in the report.

Sec. 2. **Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
