STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY

AN ACT Relating to Transfer of Pupils from One Administrative Unit to Another.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

20 MRSA § 966, sub-§ 2, ¶ A, first sentence, as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 696, § 174, is amended to read:

Whenever it is in the best interest of a resident pupil or pupils and if the parents or legal guardians approve, the superintendent of schools or the school agents may approve a transfer of the pupil or pupils from one administrative unit to another, **after obtaining the consent of the school committee or school directors of the administrative units.**

STATEMENT OF FACT

At present, superintendents may accept tuition students from adjoining towns. The purpose of this bill is to have the consent of the school committee or school directors, along with the consent of the superintendent, in order to accept tuition students.
