SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P.  
1869, L.D. 1959, Bill, "AN ACT to Amend the Laws Relating  
to Ambulance Service."

Amend the Amendment by striking out all of the last  
paragraph on page one and inserting in its place the following:

'Further amend the Bill in section 5 by striking out  
all of paragraph B of subsection 7 and inserting in its  
place the following:

B. One of the cardiopulmonary resuscitator courses,  
with the appropriate examinations and tests, which  
shall be recognized as valid for 12 months from  
the date of completion; or'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide 3 alternatives  
for attaining the minimum level of training required for  
licensure as licensed ambulance personnel. The minimum level  
of training would be one of the 3 alternatives rather than  
all 3, as the bill presently requires.
