SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1869, L.D. 1959, Bill, "AN ACT to Amend the Laws Relating to Ambulance Service."

Amend the Amendment by striking out all of the 3rd paragraph and inserting in its place the following:

'Further amend the Bill in section 5 by striking out all the underlined of/subparagraph (2) of paragraph A of subsection 7 and inserting in its place the following:

(2) The Department of Transportation Crash Injury Management Course or First Responder Course, with appropriate examinations and tests, which shall be recognized as valid for 3 years from the date of completion;'

Statement of Fact

The amendment returns to the language of the bill in describing the Department of Transportation courses which may be used to fulfill the requirements for licensing; it does add the word "or" to show that either the Crash Injury Management Course or the First Responder Course is included.
