HOUSE AMENDMENT "D" H.P. 1936, L.D. 1988, Bill, "AN ACT
Relating to Periodic Justification of Departments and Agencies
of State Government under the Maine Sunset Law."

Amend the Bill in Part B by striking out under the caption
"AGRICULTURE, DEPARTMENT OF" the following:

'Agricultural Marketing Services

Positions	(-7)
Personal Services	(\$100,000)
All Other	(28,200)
Capital Expenditures	(10,300)

Provides for the transfer of
3 positions and funds to the
Division of Inspections to
enforce the branding law.
Four positions are eliminated.'

Further amend the Bill in Part B by striking out all of
the last line and inserting in its place the following:

'TOTAL PART B - GENERAL FUND (\$283,200)'

Further amend the Bill in Part C under the caption "AGRICULTURE, DEPARTMENT OF" by striking out under "Consumer Services" the following:

"Positions	(3)
Personal Services	\$42,800
All Other	12,070

Provided for by the transfer of 3 positions and funds from Agricultural Marketing Services. These 3 positions shall be used primarily to provide for

inspection of grocery stores, apple storage facilities and other food manufacturers to enforce various food laws, including the branding laws which are administered by the Department of Agriculture."

Further amend the Bill in Part C by striking out all of the last line and inserting in its place the following:

'TOTAL PART C - GENERAL FUND \$176,200'

The purpose of this amendment/eliminate from the bill the provision for the transfer of 3 positions and funds to the Division of Inspections to enforce the branding law and the elimination of four positions.
