## AMENDMENT

SENATE / " B" to S.P. 772, relating the the Office of Energy Resources.

Amend the order by striking out everything and inserting in its place the following:

'Whereas, the Office of Energy Resources was established and partially funded by the Legislature in 1974 to provide emergency and long-range planning, management and development of energy resources in this State; and

Whereas, the Executive Department has accepted on behalf of the State the administration of significant federal funding to assure its effective expenditure in a manner appropriate to specific needs of this State; and

Whereas, escalation of energy costs has resulted in a severe economic burden on every segment of society and on the cost of State Government and has generated the need for a massive federal fuel assistance program, the costs of which are also ultimately borne by the taxpayers of this State; and

Whereas, the functions of the Office of Energy Resources appear to provide the best governmental approach toward minimizing the economic trauma of individuals, industry and government by assisting Maine people in their efforts to

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conserve energy and to make the transition to a future of increasingly expensive energy; now, therefore be it

Ordered, the House concurring, that the Joint Standing Committee on Energy and Natural Resources shall monitor the activities of the Office of Energy Resources to assure that this expenditure of funds is effective and appropriate to the needs of Maine and to provide liaison between the Legislature and the Office of energy Resources to assure appropriate legislative support for effective programs administered by that Office; and be it further
