HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 28, L.D. 32, Bill, "AN ACT
Pertaining to Employment of Minors in Hotels and Motels."

Amend the bill by inserting after the enacting clause
the following:

'Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, last ¶, as amended by PL 1969,
c. 504, §43, is further amended to read:

Employees who are under the age of 19 and are regularly
enrolled in an educational institution or are on vacation there-
from may be paid a rate of not less than 75% of the applicable
minimum wage rate required for other employees in the same
occupation, unless they are employees working in a hotel,
motel or rooming house, in which case they shall be paid the
minimum wage.'

Further amend the bill by renumbering sections 1 to 4
to be sections 2 to 5.

Statement of Fact

This amendment would require that the minimum wage be paid
to those minors whom the bill will allow to work in hotels and
motels.
