STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Create a Special Moped License for Persons 16 Years and Over.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. 29 MRSA § 530, sub-§ 2, ¶D, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 692, § 3, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
 - D. Mopeds may be operated by any person who possesses a moped license issued under section 544-A. Mopeds may not be operated upon interstate highways or upon any way upon which a bicycle is prohibited.
 - Sec. 2. 29 MRSA § 544-A is enacted to read:
- § 544-A. Moped license

The Secretary of State shall prepare suitable blanks for applicants for a license to operate a moped. Applicants shall be at least 16 years of age. The moped license shall be conspicuously different from any other license. Before a moped license is granted, the applicant shall successfully pass a written examination prepared by the Secetary of State. No other examination is required. The fees for a moped license are the same as for a Class 3 license.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill creates a special moped license available for persons 16 years or older. A written examination would be required, but no other examination.
