COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 123, L.D. 155, Bill,  
"AN ACT to Establish a Sign on the Maine Turnpike for York  
Beach Region."

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the  
title and inserting in its place the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do  
not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless  
enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, a sign designating the York/<sup>Beach</sup>Region is necessary  
for the benefit of the State and its citizens; and

Whereas, the sign designating the region should be similar  
in format and arrangement to other signs constructed and main-  
tained on the Maine Turnpike; and

Whereas, this sign should be constructed prior to the beginning  
of the summer season; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create  
an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and  
require the following legislation as immediately necessary for  
the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,  
therefore,

Be it enacted by the People fo the State of Maine, as follows:

23 MRSA §1201, sub-§32 is enacted to read:

32. York ~~region~~. Such sign shall be constructed and main-  
tained on the Maine Turnpike not more than 2 miles northerly from

exit 1 and shall be worded as follows:

RECREATIONAL AREA

YORK BEACH — YORK

YORK HARBOR

CAPE NEDDICK

YORK EXIT

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Statement of Fact

This amendment provides for a sign on the Maine Turnpike to indicate the York-York Beach region exit.
