HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" S.P. 82, L.D. 179, Resolve, "RESOLVE,
Designating the Scenic Overlook on Interstate 95 in T1-R6 WELS
as "The Albert J. 'Allie' Cole Memorial Scenic Overlook."

Amend the resolve by striking out all of the last paragraph
before the Statement of Fact, and inserting in its place the
following:

Designation of Interstate Highway System. Resolved: That
in recognition of the outstanding and unselfish service rendered
by the late Brian M. Jewett to the State of Maine that the Inter-
state Highway System in Maine, except for the bridges across the
Kennebec River from Fairfield to Benton and except for the bridges
across the Penobscot River in the Town of Medway and except for
the other bridges from Stillwater to Houlton and except for the
Maine Turnpike from the Kittery Entrance to the Gardiner Inter-
change and the bridge across the Piscataqua River from Kittery
to Portsmouth, New Hampshire, and except for the scenic overlook
in T1-R6 WELS, be named the "Brian M. Jewett Memorial Highway"
and that appropriate plaques designating the name of the highway
be erected and maintained by the State Highway Commission at such
locations in rest areas as the State Highway Commission shall
select.'


