## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 110TH LEGISLATURE FIRST REGULAR SESSION

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 167, L.D. 191, Bill, "AN ACT Authorizing the Town of Lincolnville to Employ a Superintendent of Schools and Supervising Principal."

Amend the Bill by striking out of section 2 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 2. Referendum; effective date. The legal voters of the Towns of Lincolnville, Hope and Appleton and of School Administrative District No. 28, Camden and Rockport, shall vote on the following article at properly called referenda to be held within 60 days of the effective date of this Act:

"Shall the voters of the Towns of Lincolnville, Hope and Appleton and of School Administrative District No. 28, Camden and Rockport, authorize the Town of Lincolnville to withdraw from the supervisory union consisting of Lincolnville, Hope and Appleton and School Administrative District No. 28?"

In addition, the voters of the Town of Lincolnville shall vote on the following article:

"Shall the voters of the Town of Lincolnville authorize the school committee to employ a qualified person to serve as super-intendent of schools and as a supervising principal?"

The results of the vote on the first article shall be sent to the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services who shall add the votes from the Towns of Lincolnville, Hope and

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " $\mathcal{A}$ " to H.P. 167, L.D. 191 -2-Appleton and from School Administrative District No. 28, shall declare the results and shall file a copy of the results with the Secretary of State.

The results of the vote in Lincolnville on the 2nd article shall be declared by the municipal officers of that town, and the town clerk of Lincolnville shall file a certificate of the results with the Secretary of State.

The Town of Lincolnville shall be deemed to be a separate supervisory unit if both of the articles are approved by a majority of the legal voters voting at the election in Lincoln-ville and the first article is approved by a majority of the legal voters voting at the elections in the Towns of Lincolnville, Hope and Appleton and in School Administrative District No. 28, Camden and Rockport.

If the articles have been approved as set forth in this Act, Lincolnville shall become a separate supervisory unit as of July 1, 1982.

## Statement of Fact

This amendment requires referenda to be held in the Towns of Lincolnville, Hope and Appleton and in School Administrative District No. 28 on the question of whether Lincolnville may withdraw from the supervisory unit which includes those 5 administrative units. The voters of Lincolnville must approve the creation of Lincolnville as a separate supervisory unit as well as a majority of all the voters in the 5 administrative units.
