SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A"  
to S.P. 128, L.D. 300, Bill, "AN ACT to Provide an Open  
Season on Moose for a One-year Period."

Amend the Amendment by striking out all of the 3rd  
paragraph after the title and inserting in its place the  
following:

'Further amend the Bill in section 2 in that part  
designated "§7463-A." by striking out all of subsections 4 and 5  
and inserting in / <sup>their</sup> place the following:

'4. Hunting permits. The commissioner may issue up  
to 1,000 moose hunting permits annually and may establish the  
number of moose hunting permits to be issued for each moose  
hunting zone. A person whose application is selected may  
purchase a moose hunting permit upon presentation of proof  
that he possesses a valid Maine hunting license.

The fee for a moose hunting permit is \$25. At the time the  
permit is obtained, the permittee may designate a subpermittee  
to hunt with him. The permittee may choose not to designate  
a subpermittee and hunt alone, but a subpermittee must always  
be accompanied by the permittee while hunting moose.

5. Eligibility. Any Maine resident who is eligible  
to obtain a Maine hunting license is eligible to apply for a  
moose hunting permit.'
