STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Repeal the Law Barring Minors from Bowling Alleys, Pool Rooms and Shooting Galleries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

8 MRSA § 3 is repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Presently, the licensee of a bowling alley or pool room is subject to criminal penalties if he allows a minor on the premises after having been forbidden from doing so by the parents. The law is unworkable, is not enforced and should be repealed.
