COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 286, L.D. 333, Resolve,
Authorizing Gerald Pelletier to Bring Civil Action Against
the State of Maine.

Amend the Resolve by striking out all of the 2nd, 3rd,
4th and 5th paragraphs after the title.

Further amend the Resolve in the last paragraph before
the Statement of Fact in the 5th line (4th line in L.D.) by
striking out the figure "\$3,000,000" and inserting in its
place the figure '\$300,000'

Statement of Fact

This amendment strikes out the lengthy statement of
facts forming the basis of the State's alleged liability from
the body of the resolve.

The amendment further provides a limit of \$300,000
on any recovery. This is consistent with the limit set
in the Tort Claims Act, Title 14, section 8105.
