STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend the Maine Tort Claims Act to Remove Restrictions on Governmental Liability for Negligent Acts which Result in the Discharge of Certain Toxic Substances.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- 14 MRSA § 8104, sub-§ 3, as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 578, § 2, is amended to read:
- 3. In the sudden and accidental discharge, dispersal, release or escape of smoke, vapors, soot, fumes, acids, alkalines, toxic chemicals, liquids or gases, waste materials or other irritants, contaminants or pollutants into or upon land, the atmosphere or any water course or body of water; and

STATEMENT OF FACT

The intent of this bill is to remove unreasonable restrictions on governmental liability for negligent acts which result in injury to persons or property through the release of highly dangerous toxic substances.
