STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

**AN ACT to Require an Examination for Real Estate Brokers Seeking Credit for
Continuing Education Attendance.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

32 MRSA § 4115-B, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 196, § 2, is amended by adding after the 3rd paragraph a new paragraph to read:

Credit for attending the required number of hours under this section is available only to those who receive a passing grade in an examination taken at the completion of the required number of hours. The commission shall promulgate rules to establish an examination procedure.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires real estate brokers, who are now required to attend continuing education courses to receive a passing grade in an examination to be eligible for credits based on attendance.
