COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 210, L.D. 575, Bill, "AN ACT to Increase the Fees of the Bureau of Insurance."

Amend the bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Bureau of Insurance operates exclusively on dedicated revenues; and

Whereas, unless the revenues dedicated to the Bureau of Insurance are increased immediately, that agency will be unable to continue to carry out effectively the responsibilities given it by law; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergencycited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Fiscal Note

It is estimated that enactment of this bill will result in an increase in dedicated revenue of \$505,730 for the biennium.'

Statement of Fact

The purposes of this amendment are to add an emergency enactor and a fiscal note to the bill.
