STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Require the Public Utilities Commission to Consider Issues of Operational Efficiency in Rate Cases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

35 MRSA § 51, last sentence, as last amended by PL 1975, c. 409, is further amended to read:

In determining just and reasonable rates, the commissioner ~~may~~ **shall** consider whether the utility is operating as efficiently as possible and is utilizing sound management practices.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Questions about the operational efficiency and management practices of public utilities have become a source of increasing consumer concern and frustration in recent years. With utility charges continually rising, public resentment over paying for the costs of mistakes and mismanagement has grown.

Because of financial and time constraints, as well as internal priorities of the Public Utilities Commission, these issue have not received adequate consideration during deliberations on rate increase requests. This bill would require full consideration of these issues.
