STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Permit a Person, other than the Superintendent of Schools, to Keep a Record of Meetings of a School Administrative District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

20 MRSA § 221, as amended by PL 1975, c. 746, § 5, is further amended by adding at the end 2 new sentences to read:

The superintendent may request that another person, whose name he shall present to the board, be appointed to keep an accurate record of all meetings of the School Administrative District. If the board approves, the person chosen shall keep the records subject to the supervision and approval of the superintendent.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Presently, the superintendent must take the minutes of meetings of the School Administrative District. This bill authorizes the board of directors to approve the selection of someone else to perform that function, subject to the supervision of the superintendent.
