STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Place Restrictions on Certain Horses using Roads and Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

29 MRSA § 1752, as amended by PL 1977, c. 32, is further amended to read:

No person may permit a horse to use any portion of a public way, if the horse is wearing uncovered, cleated shoes which damage the pavement.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill would require that horses wearing cleated shoes, which damage pavement, have the cleats covered or removed before using any portion of a public way.
