HOUSE \longleftrightarrow AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 892, L.D. 996, Resolve,
Requiring the State Planning Office to Conduct an Educational
Program on Manufactured Housing, and Directing the Committee
on Local and County Government to Monitor and Report on the
Program.

Amend the resolve by striking out all of the emergency
preamble.

Further
/amend the resolve in the first paragraph after the pre-
amble by striking out in the 4th and 5th lines (4th line in
L.D.) the words "ordinances pertaining to"

Further amend the resolve by striking out all of the last
2 paragraphs before the emergency clause and inserting in their
place the following:

'Resolved: That the State Planning Office shall report
to the legislative committee having jurisdiction over local
and county government, by January 15, 1982, on the activities
conducted under this program,' and be it further

Resolved: That the legislative committee having jurisdiction
over local and county government shall monitor the progress
of municipal ordinances on manufactured housing and, in
March 1982, shall review that progress, reconsider the necessity
for state legislation concerning the siting of manufactured
housing and report their findings to the Second Regular Session
of the 110th Legislature, including recommended legislation,
if appropriate.'

Further amend the resolve by striking out all of the emergency clause.

Statement of Fact

This amendment has 2 purposes. The first is to make the subject matter of the educational program the more general topic of manufactured housing rather than limiting it to ordinances pertaining to manufactured housing. The 2nd is to delete the unrealistic timetable set for reporting on the response of municipalities to the educational program.
