STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Provide for an Inactive License for Barbers and Beauticians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

32 MRSA § 407-A is enacted to read:

§ 407-A. Nonactive renewal registration

A nonactive renewal certificate of registration shall be issued to any registered person not practicing barbering within the State who on or before the first day of the January in which his registration expires, and biennially, on or before the first day of January thereafter, pays a renewal fee of \$25 to the secretary of the board.

Any person who fails or neglects to procure his biennial nonactive renewal registration, in order to require registration, must pay the nonactive renewal fee in addition to the sum of all fees that person may be in arrears.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is intended to establish a 2 license system for barbers and beauticians, active and inactive. Presently many barbers and beauticians for a variety of reasons may temporarily leave employment but are still required to pay the annual fee, which can be a hardship. This bill will encourage those who have gone through all the training and expense of obtaining a license, to maintain their license during periods where they are not using it.
