STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Concerning Retirement of Personnel at the Maine Correctional Center and the Maine Youth Center.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA § 1095, sub-§ 5, first sentence, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 622, § 38-B, is amended to read:

Each employee of the Maine State Prison who is an incumbent in a position described in section 1121, subsection 4, paragraph F, shall contribute at a rate of 7.5% of earnable compensation until he has attained eligibility for retirement under section 1121, subsection 4, paragraph F.

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA § 1121, sub-§ 4, \P F, as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 580, § 11, is amended to read:

F. Any member who is the warden or deputy warden of the Maine State Prison, or any officer or employee of the Maine State Prison employed as a guard, or engaged in any management of prisoners, or as the supervising officers of any such guards or employees or is the superintendent or deputy or assistant superintendent of the Maine Correctional Center or Maine Youth Center, or any officer or employee of any such institution and in any case, who has at least 20 years of creditable service in his respective capacity, or cumulatively in any combination of such prison employment capacities may retire at age 50 on a service retirement allowance, which shall be equal to 1/2 of

his average final compensation and an additional 2% of his average final compensation for each year of membership service not included in the age and service conditions for retirement under this paragraph.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide for retirement of personnel at the Maine Correctional Center and the Maine Youth Center on the basis as retirement for Maine State Prison personnel.
